

12 noon eat


Immediately after we finish eating:

CocoBella was in foster care probably the longest of any dog we've ever had in rescue, but it took time for the right family to come along that we felt confident would be the right environment for CocoBella to thrive. We think we found it with Dianne and Tim. It has only been less than a week since she's been in her new home, but we are optimistic that things will work out for Bella.

Here is an excerpt from an update on CocoBella from her new "mom".

"We are so happy with her and so glad you found us for her. We will stay in touch with info and updates on Bella. She is so sweet and cuddly and makes us laugh all the time. She is such a sweetheart - she sits on the couch at night between Tim and I and turns to each of us for petting and loving - we get the "Bella paw" if we don't respond quickly enough! Her new favorite position is sprawled on her back with her lip folds covering her eyes - it makes me happy to see her so comfortable in her new home."

Bobo had his palate clip and it did him a world of good. He is still a messy eater, but at least he no longer struggles to breath and eat at the same time. According to Dr. Jim, Bobo's soft palate was "as long as a freight train", so he will breath much easier now that it has been shortened.

Bobo has been in his new home for a little over a week. Things seem to be going well with Bobo also. Bobo's new "dad" said this about Bobo: Bobo is doing great! It looks like he adjusted easily, and already feels comfortable with us. We thank you for allowing us to adopt and give him a new home."

CABIN FEVER!!!!


