We had a lot going on with rescue this past month. Howie is in his new home and he seems to be fitting in nicely. Here is Howie with his new family -- Matt and Erin and new "sister", Nittany.

We have three new dogs in foster care. Here are their stories:

Spring came into rescue on November 4th. Spring was purchased from a "backyard breeder" by a couple that had good intentions, but did not realize that their home was not the correct environment for Spring. Spring was used as a breeding animal by her previous owners, and they sold her when they no longer wanted to breed her.

Spring's new owners didn't realize how poorly socialized Spring was. Spring probably hadn't done much besides sit around in a kennel situation when she wasn't having babies. Spring was terrified to be on a leash and was afraid of everything when they brought her home, including them. Because their yard was not fully fenced and her fear of being on a leash, she kept having accidents in their house. After one week of total failure to get Spring to potty outside for them, they contacted us. They did not want to return her to the place where she became so frightened of people and felt we could find her a better home than they were able to provide.



Spring is sweet as can be, but slow to warm up to people she does not know. She is also slow to adapt to new situations. Spring takes a while to trust people, but once she decides that you are OK, she is quite affectionate. She loves to give "kisses" once she decides you are worthy of them.



Samson was surrendered to a local animal shelter because his former owners said they could not afford the surgery Sampson required. Sampson needed a surgery called "ear ablation". This surgery is required when ear canals have extensive damage from chronic ear infections. Both of Sam's ear canals were almost completely closed up and oozing puss. A surgeon offered to perform the delicate and expensive surgery provided a rescue group was willing to take Sam and find him a suitable home. Sam has had one ear canal removed and will have the second surgery soon. Once he has healed up from his 2nd surgery, Sam can go to his new home and his ears should no longer be a problem for him.

Good Deeds

Sam is an easy-going fellow and gets along very well with his foster "siblings". For now, Sam seems to be able to hear just fine. However, ear ablation surgery sometimes results in hearing impairment to varying degrees. So it is possible that Sam may end up with permanent hearing loss, but he can still be a great companion for the right family. Sampson has been cared for by Karen Niznik and her family for the past three weeks. Karen has fostered for a local Boxer rescue group as well as fostered other breeds for another rescue group in the past. We are very happy to have another foster "mom" on our team, especially one with her level of experience. Welcome Karen!



Coco-Bella is 3 ½ years old. She is a new arrival and will be in foster care while we evaluate her temperament. Bella has been having some undesirable dominance behaviors towards neighborhood children. Bella will need an experienced owner without children that is committed to working with her to teach how to behave appropriately.

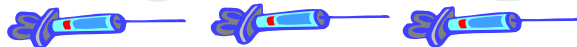

Greetings:



The goal of The Rabies Challenge Fund Charitable Trust is to extend the legally required interval for rabies boosters to 5 and then 7 years, based on the findings of the rabies challenge studies currently by Dr. Ronald Schultz at the University of Wisconsin School of Veterinary Medicine. If the studies' results demonstrate that the rabies vaccine confers 5, and possibly 7, years of immunity, there would be a significant impact on controlling rabies and reducing adverse reactions associated with the vaccine.

Today I am writing to ask for your help. The Rabies Challenge Fund relies on donations to finance the multi-year challenge studies that began in November 2007. Dr. W. Jean Dodds and I are Co-Trustees of The Rabies Challenge Fund, and our current challenge is to raise \$150,000 for the 4th year's budget in addition to collecting \$150,000 per year to cover Years 5 through 7.

All donations received will be used to finance the direct research costs of the rabies challenge studies.

- ♦ If you want to grow up to be a school mascot you need to practice the school song.

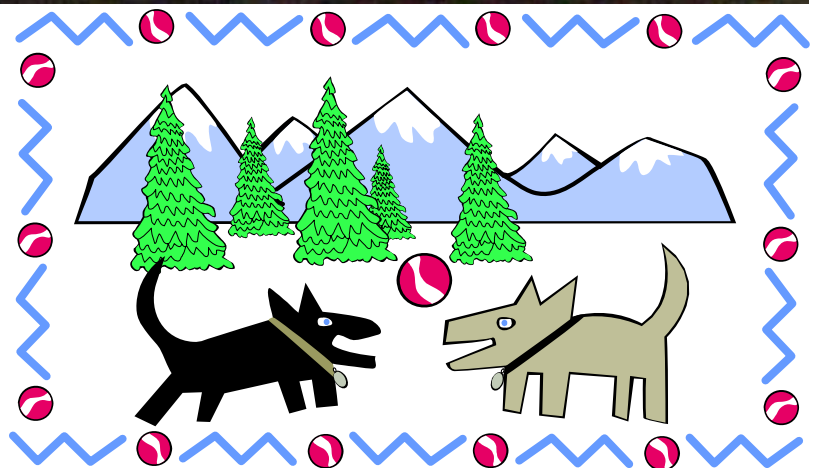
