

We are going to have an animal behaviorist evaluate Coco-Bella before rehoming her to make sure we are on the right track with her and can confidently rehome her. Every so often I get asked by people if it is hard to part with the dogs we foster and if I am ever tempted to adopt one myself. I tell people that fostering dogs really is not that much different than being a child-care provider. People don't ask day care "moms" if they find it difficult to part with their "kids", they know that they can't keep someone else's

children. Doing foster care for dogs really is very similar. When you know you don't get to keep them, you enjoy them and "get attached" to them, but you don't give your heart to your foster dog completely. A wise foster caretaker knows that their home may not be the best home for that dog and the whole point of doing breed rescue is to find the best home for that particular dog, not just a home. And if everybody allowed themselves to become too attached to their foster dogs, there would be no place for future rescue dogs to stay. Foster caretakers have to think about the big picture when committing to doing foster care for a rescue group, but it isn't as hard as you may think. If you have ever thought about fostering, but the thought that you might get "too attached" to your foster dog has held you back, think about the day care moms out there. If they can do it, so can you.


